Stipends were awarded for PASS related studies to Rob Davis, Mark Shadle, Donald Wolff, Kay Firor, Jennifer Woodworth, Anna Cavinato, Sherry Edvalson, and Christian Steinmetz. In addition, a PASS calibration Institute was formed.
